Creag Dhubh to Dalmally overhead line, Creag Dhubh substation and North Argyll overhead line reinforcement

December 2024

To give you an insight into what works and activities are coming up on our Creag Dhubh to Dalmally overhead line (OHL), as well as the Creag Dhubh substation and North Argyll overhead line reinforcement, the relevant project teams have created this quarterly newsletter.

The newsletter will share an overview of the works underway and keep you updated with how the projects are progressing during construction. The newsletter can be downloaded from the documents section of each corresponding project website.



Creag Dhubh substation project

This project consists of the construction of a new 275/132kV Gas Insulated Switchgear (GIS) substation at Creag Dhubh. This substation will be connected from the Scottish Power Energy Networks (SPEN) Transmission Dalmally – Windyhill 275kV OHL via 13.5km of proposed new 275kV double circuit steel tower OHL. The project team have been focusing on the earthworks package the last few months with the aim to have this finalised by early 2025. The team will then move on to the construction of the new 132kV and 275kV GIS Buildings.



Creag Dhubh to Dalmally overhead line project

This project will see the construction of a new 13km 275kV OHL (comprising of 47 no.steel lattice towers) between the proposed Creag Dhubh substation and the tie in to the existing SPEN Transmission overhead line at Glen Lochy (Succoth Glen) and a tie in connection of the existing 132kV Taynuilt to Inveraray OHL to the proposed new Creag Dhubh substation.

Following the Public Local Inquiry (PLI) that concluded in June 2023 planning consent was granted by Scottish Ministers in August of this year. We commenced enabling works in October 2024. Construction start is programmed for March 2025.

Creag Dhubh to Inveraray overhead line project

We recently received consent for this project in September 2024. This project will see the construction of a new 275kV double circuit overhead line between Creag Dhubh substation (established as part of the Creag Dhubh - Dalmally 275kV project) and a tee point on the Inveraray - Crossaig circuit. The overhead line is proposed to be 9km (comprising of 34 no. L8c steel lattice towers).

We have started enabling works as of December 2024 on this project, such as forestry and private water supply sampling with construction expected to start in March 2025.


